
For viewers who are not familiar with Ebola, here is what we know about the virus and how it can spread.

Before I got sick, I did not believe in Ebola. I thought it was not serious and that it could never catch a man like me.









Yes, but, people are mostly catching Ebola from attending funerals and caring for sick family members.
















That was a big mistake! If you get treatment for Ebola quickly, you have a better chance of survival!


I should have called 4455 to get help as soon as I felt sick. If you don't treat Ebola, it will not just go away, it will get worse!



Avoid sick people


